

2024 Project Record Book Requirements


- 1. All books must be signed by the exhibitor and parent and/or leader.





Draw a Blaze(a broad stripe that typically runs the length of the face)




Draw a Snip(a roundish blotch between the nostrils)

Leave other horses besides your horse alone.


Always walk up to a horse correctly and safely.
